## Outbreaks of salmonellosis in North America linked to chia seed products - products imported into New Zealand

The Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) are advising that batches of Navitas Naturals and Williams-Sonoma products containing chia seeds that have been implicated in salmonellosis outbreaks in North America have been imported for sale in New Zealand. So far there have been 17 cases associated with these products in the USA and 34 cases in Canada.

The serotypes involved in the outbreaks are: *Salmonella* Newport, *Salmonella* Hartford and *Salmonella* Oranienburg. Some cases have required hospitalisation; no deaths have been reported either from USA or Canada. To date no cases of salmonellosis in New Zealand have been linked to these products.

Investigations by MPI indicate that there appears to be a single direct importer and distributor for the products in New Zealand, and that distribution appears to be the upper North Island (Auckland and Northland) only. Distribution has been to health food retailers and sales to customers have occurred via the internet and retail outlets. The company has contacted customers and carried out a trade level recall of product. Around 107 units in total of sprouted seed powder and 47 units of the omega blend smoothie mix have been sold to consumers.

As products containing the implicated chia seed can be also be imported directly via the internet MPI is putting out a wider general food safety alert.

Consumers are advised that they **should not eat** any of these products and **either dispose of them or return** them to the retailer.

Regional Public Health will ask all new cases of Salmonellosis if they have consumed the implicated chia seed products during their incubation period.
