## Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) Update from the Ministry of Health

## 1. Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) Updated Information for Health Professionals (version 12-11-14)

Significant changes to updated document:

- Updated case definitions to state 'fever or history of fever' due to evolving international evidence on use of specific temperatures and expert technical advice.
- Updates to Infection Prevention Control guidance (appendix 3), including insertion of waste procedures and clarification of primary care PPE requirements in the 'Summary of Personal Protective Equipment Requirements' section.
- Amendments to 'Contact Tracing and Management' section 2.4.
- Addition of the National Referral Pathways EVD (appendix 4)

## 2. Patient Management Guideline for Primary Care: Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) (version 12-11-14)

Significant changes to updated document:

- Minor changes to contents of 'pathways.'
- Simplification of when EVD should be suspected.

The situation with EVD internationally is rapidly evolving, so these documents are being reviewed on a fortnightly cycle. The Ministry of Health would appreciate any feedback on their content, which they will continue to integrate in future revisions.
