Child Health Cluster

The Child Health Cluster is part of Regional Public Health, delivering health services to the greater Wellington region

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The School Health Team

Our services are confidential, provided free of charge and available Monday to Friday. While our focus is on schools in high needs areas, every school has access to a Public Health Nurse.

Public Health Nurses

- Support children referred by parents/caregivers or schools
- Assess, advocate and refer to hospital, outpatients, specialists or education services
- Link children and families with community and social services
- Support access to health care
- Focus on high need areas to advise and support schools
- Respond to pandemics and public health emergencies

Immunisation Nurses

Provide Year 7 Boostrix and Year 8 girls and boys HPV vaccines in schools.

BCG Nurses

Provide eligible babies up to six months old with the BCG vaccine from a Lead Maternity Carer referral.

Children up to five years will also be seen following a discussion with the nurses.

Health Promotion Activities

Public Health Nurses promote a range of activities in schools including:

- Smoke-free living
- SunSmart
- Mental well-being
- Oral health
- Healthy eating
- Physical activity
- Healthy relationships
- Resources and regular information
- Water-only school

Community Mobile Ear Clinic

The Porirua Community Mobile Ear Clinic is a free nurse-led service for children aged 0-18 years.

The Ear Nurses:

- Have specialist knowledge of ears and associated problems
- Offer assessment of ears, advice and some minor treatment
- Refer children to Audiology, Ear, Nose and Throat clinics and other health and education services

Vision and Hearing Technicians

Provide vision and hearing screening and advice in early childhood centres, B4 School Check clinics, schools and health centres.
